

Why Summer Reading?

If you have kids in school, you've likely heard the term "summer slide." That's what happens with kids who don't read when school is out. They stagnate or fall behind in reading skills and reliable research shows that they don't catch up during the next school year. The gap gets bigger every year between the kids who read in the summer and those who don't.

How to Prevent the Summer Slide

Sign up for summer reading — adults and kids alike!

Allow kids to choose what they want to read.

Have plenty of books, magazines, and comic books around the house.

Make sure some reading happens every day.



Adults, be a good role model. Let the kids see you reading.
