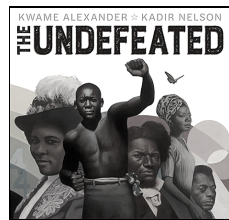
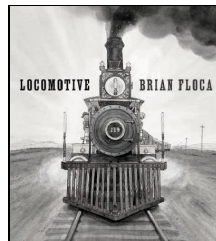
- Henkes, Kevin

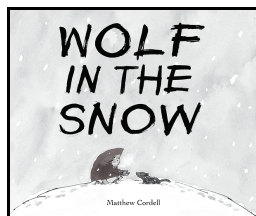

The Lion & The Mouse

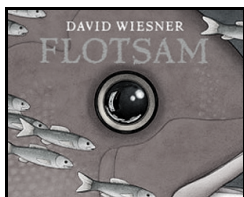
A retelling of the Aesop fable, where a lion shows mercy to a mouse who later returns the favor.

Flotsam

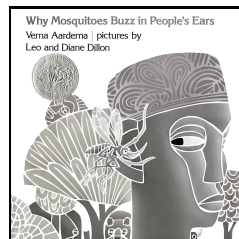
A boy goes to the beach to collect things and discovers an underwater camera that contains a collection of unusual pictures.

The Girl Who Loved Wild Horses

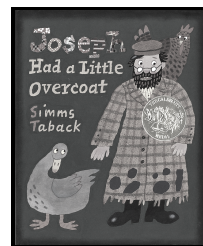
Though she loves her people, a girl prefers to live among the wild horses where she is truly happy and free.

Joseph's overcoat is recycled into new (smaller) garments in a tale based on a Yiddish folk song.

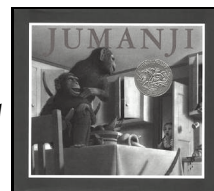

Three sisters staying home alone must outwit a hungry wolf disguised as their grandmother.

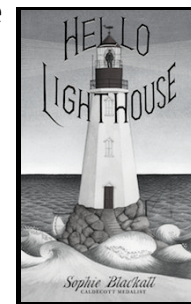

Ox-Cart Man

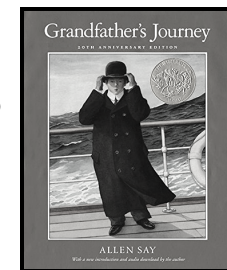
Describes the daily life of an early nineteenth century New England family throughout the changing seasons.
